*Polling was conducted online from June 12-18 2020. Using its Bias Correct Engine to attain a representative sample, Change Research polled 841 likely 2020 voters ages 18-39 in ten battleground states ( AZ, GA, FL, NC, NH, WI, PA, MI, TX, MN). Post-stratification was performed on age, gender, race/ethnicity, and region and 2016 presidential vote.*
