### **Survey Methodology**



Civiqs polled 1,079 Democratic and Democratic-leaning Independent registered voters age 18-39 in Arizona, Florida, Georgia, Michigan, Minnesota, North Carolina, New Hampshire, Pennsylvania, Texas, and Wisconsin from August 4-7, 2020.

The survey was conducted online, among selected members of the Civiqs research panel.

Survey results are weighted by age, race, gender, education, party identification, and state. The survey has a margin of error of  $\pm 3.4\%$ .










When thinking about how coronavirus has impacted your life, which of the following are you most worried about?




When thinking about addressing changes to affordable healthcare, which of the following do you think is most important to address?


When thinking about addressing changes to affordable healthcare, which of the following do you think is most important to address?

When thinking about addressing changes to affordable healthcare, which of the following do you think is **second** most important to address?




Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of Joe Biden?



# Very unfavorable attitudes towards President Trump




Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of Donald Trump?

If the general election for President were held today, who would you vote for?




Note: High turnout respondents "definitely plan" to vote in the November 2020 general election and are "extremely motivated" to vote for president, congress, *and* state and local races.


#### Has Joe Biden's campaign contacted you in the past month?



# Biden campaign contact, by race






Has Donald Trump's campaign contacted you in the past month?



#### Voter turnout: Under-25 voters most mobile




Which of the following best describes where you'll be living when it is time to vote?



# Young Black voters most likely to vote in person




Which of the following comes closest to your views about voting in the 2020 general election?



# COVID-19 tops concerns about voting in person




When thinking about potentially voting in person, which would you say is your greatest concern?

When thinking about potentially voting by mail, which would you say is your greatest concern?





#### National news outlets are most trusted sources




Which source do you trust most to get information about national and local issues?
