

# National Survey Results: Young People on the State of the Nation

January 2022

United States, age 17-39



## **Survey Methodology**



Civiqs polled 1936 young people age 17-39 nationwide from January 2-6, 2022.

The survey was conducted online, among selected members of the Civiqs research panel.

Survey results are weighted by age, gender, race, education, and party identification. Respondents include an oversample of Asian-Americans and Pacific Islanders (AAPI) to increase the precision of survey results for that subgroup. The survey has a margin of error of  $\pm 2.5\%$ .




Thinking about the future of the United States, do you usually feel:

Generally speaking, which of these best describes your feelings about politicians in Washington, DC today?




Generally speaking, which of these best describes your feelings about your state and local government today?



## Politicians' Priority by Economic Status, by Party




Who do you think political leaders in Washington, DC care the most about?



## Joe Biden Favorable Rating, by Age




Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of Joe Biden?



## Democrats in Congress Favorable Rating, by Age




Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of Democrats in Congress?



# Republicans in Congress Favorable Rating, by Age




Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of Republicans in Congress?



## Democrats in Congress Favorable Rating, by Race







# Opinion of Democrats in Congress, by Party




Has your opinion of Democrats in Congress changed since they won control of the U.S. House and Senate in the 2020 elections?


Has your opinion of Democrats in Congress changed since they won control of the U.S. House and Senate in the 2020 elections?




As you may know, the Biden Administration has extended the pause on student loan payments until May 1st. Do you support or oppose this extension?

What comes closest to your views on actions the Biden Administration should take regarding student loan debt?




## Biden Administration - Student Loan Debt, by Race

## **Priorities for Voting and Election Integrity**




What are the two most important issues for elected officials to address around voting and elections, among those listed here? (Percent selecting each option)


Do you think that Congress should be doing more to investigate and hold people accountable for the January 6, 2021 attack on the U.S. Capitol building?

Do you think that Congress should be doing more to investigate and hold people accountable for the January 6, 2021 attack on the U.S. Capitol building?




# Increasing Political Impact for Young People, by Age
