



The Alliance for Youth Action is a federated network of nineteen youth-led grassroots organizations building political power for young people across the country. While each organization has its unique identity and approach to creating change, we unite as a federation to amplify our collective impact.



Update to the Alliance's governing model

In 2023, the Alliance made the decision to restructure our governing model, prioritizing our commitment to remain youth-centered as we continue to grow. Our updated structure now includes all groups within our Network, ensuring that Youth Affiliates, Multi-Generational Affiliates, and Youth Organizing Partners are represented in the Alliance's governing body, thereby having a direct influence on the Alliance's strategic decision-making process. This shift not only fortifies our capacity building, funding intermediary, and donor organizing efforts but also underscores our dedication to inclusivity and collaborative governance.













The Alliance is thrilled to have welcomed the **Georgia Youth Justice Coalition (GYJC)** into our Network in 2023, marking a significant step forward in building youth-led people power in Georgia, the South, and across the nation.

Founded in 2021, GYJC is a grassroots collective of Black, brown, LGBTQ+, working class, and allied students advocating for youth power and justice in Georgia. GYJC grew from engaging a few hundred high school and college students to dedicated local organizing campaigns impacting thousands of Georgians in six counties and six campuses.

With the largest share of 18-24-year-old voters, Georgia has become a consistent battleground state. Expanding our Network to include GYJC helps fuel the growth and sustainability of grassroots organizing led by Black youth in Georgia who have historically been and continue to be systematically under-resourced.

Throughout 2023, youth organizers at GYJC have worked tirelessly to activate youth communities, incubate movement leaders, build power, and enact meaningful wins across the battleground state.





Network Highlights

Over the course of 2023, the Alliance supported our Network with local advocacy campaigns and voter engagement programs to tackle the major challenges facing our country, including reproductive health and justice, public lands and climate change, immigrant justice, and divestment from police and reenvisioning public safety.

To support these local efforts, the Alliance provided regular coaching, funding support, and technical assistance to provide the tools and skills needed to run robust programs. Some highlights from our support include:



Wisconsin

Leaders Igniting Transformation (LIT) focused their efforts on turning out young people to vote in the Supreme Court race in an attempt to protect reproductive and voting rights as well as fair election maps. In the lead up to the April elections, LIT engaged in extensive grassroots efforts to knock on over 23,000 doors, send over 12,000 texts, and send over 31,000 pieces of persuasive C4 mail. Additionally, LIT engaged in targeted digital advertising campaigns across Snapchat and created and distributed over 5,000 voter guides outlining crucial election information such as early voting deadlines, absentee ballot requirements, and other resources for young voters to stay informed on ballot issues. LIT's basebuilding efforts, persuasion campaigns, and targeted voter turnout resulted in Judge Janet winning the Supreme Court race, safeguarding the interests and needs of young people in Wisconsin.





Ohio

In 2023, the Ohio Student Association (OSA) was pivotal in passing several progressive legislation in 2023. OSA registered over 14,000 people, distributed over 193,000 voter guides, and knocked on over 103,000 doors to turn out and educate voters about the issues at stake in the August special elections and November elections. OSA's work organizing constituents to vote against a proposed initiative to require ballot referendums to pass with a 60% majority instead of a simple majority led to an exceptionally high turnout for the August special elections. As a result, Ohio voters rejected the proposal. Furthermore, OSA launched a campaign to place a constitutional amendment on the ballot that aimed to enshrine reproductive rights in the state. After successfully collecting enough signatures, OSA mobilized young people to vote on the constitutional amendment, thereby passing Issue I and protecting abortion access in Ohio. Despite facing some of the strictest voting laws and an unexpected special election aimed at deterring progressive voters and victories, our Affiliate's ability to organize and mobilize their communities secured crucial wins for young people across the state.



Florida

Engage Miami spent significant efforts to reform their internal voter registration systems and retraining their staff and volunteers to comply with new voter registration requirements enforced by SB 7050. Additionally, Engage Miami focused on educating young people on the recently updated vote by mail laws - ensuring everyone is aware of the shortened vote by mail period as well as the requirement to re-enroll to vote by mail every two years. Recently, Engage Miami partnered with local organizations and the ACLU of Florida to file a federal lawsuit challenging a redistricting map to oppose racial gerrymandering, protect Miami residents' voting rights, and ensure fair representation of district maps. The judge is expected to issue a ruling within the next few weeks.

Looking Forward

As we set our sights on the 2024 elections, the stakes couldn't be higher, with 41 million eligible Gen-Z voters posed to make their mark. This generation's diversity and political engagement are unparalleled, and their potential to sway the election underscores the necessity of our youth-tailored campaigns. The Alliance for Youth Action's strategic focus on battleground states and districts is crucial, as it seeks to mobilize, persuade, and register voters to win progressive legislation.

Our **capacity building** offerings allow us to confront systemic barriers that often hinder organizational success. By equipping Affiliates with the financial and compliance management skills needed to run scalable electoral lobbying programs, we not only empower our Network to mobilize youth effectively, but enhance our collective ability to advocate for meaningful change. These capacity building supports include:

New Deal for Organizing: a training program in partnership with State Voices designed to grow and sustain a significant national organizing movement.

Network Health Assessments: intensive assessments that analyze an Affiliate's financial health in relation to its program plans and development pipeline.

Site Visits: constructive visits to identify opportunities and challenges that arise in our shared journey toward empowering youth and strengthening democracy.

Multi-Entity Financial, Compliance, and Risk Management: supports the development and implementation of strategies that optimize the efficiencies of multiple entities working toward a common goal.

Cohorts: peer spaces for Affiliate staff beyond the ED-level to engage in mutual learning around data and reporting as well as managing electoral programs.

Our **voter engagement** strategy is focused on the top ten states where young people have the greatest electoral impact in shaping the federal government: Arizona, Florida, Georgia, Michigan, Montana, Nevada, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin. Through a multifaceted approach encompassing mail, digital, canvassing, and voter guide programs, we aim to reach and turn young people and other historically marginalized communities into voters.

By coupling our voter engagement strategies with our revamped **advocacy campaigns** platform, we are able to build resources and guidance to help design robust and effective campaigns that create tangible, lasting change in young people's communities. The Alliance for Youth Action supports our Network in developing and implementing advocacy and legislative campaigns around five core issues that reflect a path towards liberation: Abortion Access and Reproductive Justice, Climate and Environmental Justice, Housing, Reimagining Public Safety, and Voting Rights.

At the heart of our efforts to empower young people across the nation lies our **Youth Vote Action Campaign** - an initiative that bridges the gap between national resources and local organizing initiatives to bolster the growth of local youth organizations. This Campaign's multifaceted approach invests in data-driven campaigns, targeted messaging, and reinforcing field organizing networks to galvanize young progressive voters in key battleground states to influence progressive victories.

The Alliance for Youth Action's multifaceted commitment ensures that young voices are not only heard but lead the charge in shaping our future. Together, we're not just participating in democracy; we're redefining it, building an ecosystem where the youth lead with conviction and power to enact real change.
